Speakers: Melissa Correia and Alicia Vazquez - Newark Public Library



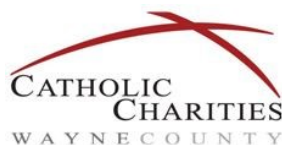
Linda Werts introduced Melissa Correia and Alicia Vazquez of the Newark Public Library. Melissa has been with the library for 2 years.

Public libraries are going through many changes. Research and reading is different today but the library is used more than ever today. School kids hang out after school, meetings are held, classes are conducted. Did you know that Newark Library pioneered walking groups? Classes include Tai Chi, healthy cooking classes, foot massage, plyo, craft classes, sewing, painting. Book clubs, scholarly, daytime, silent. The library also conducts outreach services to include the nursing home, ARC, County Jail and Candy Apple Children's Center. Alicia talked about the youth services. Those include activity nights, book club, toddler story times, free meals for kids during the summer, teen creative writing, and craft projects. The library also has free e-books. Every year 43,000 books are loaned as well as 27,000 other materials. Its meeting spaces are free. The library helps people with computers. It houses the Hoffman Clock Museum. It even sends 10-12 faxes per day for its customers!
