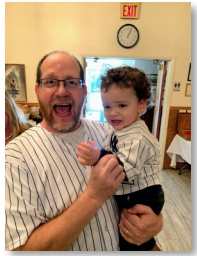

JJ reported that there are 1113 derelict properties in the area.

At the present time repair programs are working on the exterior of houses. Adam Olschewski, with Marshall Exteriors, reminded us that he had donated 30 roofs to Habitat at one time and was interested in becoming involved again. JJ is looking for volunteers and grants for her programs. Rotary was a great group to share her ideas with and we will try to connect in different ways including the Family Promise program.

If Jimmy Carter, the oldest living president can volunteer to work for Habitat, we should all be inspired to help!

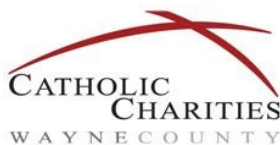
